Registration Process for Internal Clubs

All registration for internally provided clubs (which do not carry an additional cost) will be made via Firefly. The following two groups have been created on Firefly:

- Junior House Hobbies Summer Term 2026
- Senior House Hobbies Summer Term 2026

Staggered Registration

We aim to allow all our boys at St. Anthony's to have a greater opportunity to join an activity they really enjoy. Once again, we will implement a staggered registration process.

These can be applied for using Firefly.

1. The first round of the booking process will go live on Firefly on [Tuesday 17th March at 7:00pm](#). Parents will be able to make **ONE SELECTION FROM EACH GROUP OF HOBBIES ONLY**.
2. The second round of the booking process will go live on Firefly on [Wednesday 17th March at 7:00pm](#). Parents will be able to make a **SECOND SELECTION FROM EACH GROUP OF HOBBIES ONLY**.
3. The third round of the booking process will go live on Firefly on [Thursday 19th March at 7:00pm](#). Parents will be able to make a **THIRD SELECTION FROM EACH GROUP OF HOBBIES ONLY**.
4. The final round of the booking process will go live on Firefly on [Friday 20th March at 10:00am](#). Parents will be able to select as many options as possible that remain.

No bookings will be accepted after the **booking system closes on Tuesday 24th March at 12:00pm**.



Registration Process for External Clubs

- Please sign up for Externally Provided Clubs using ParentPay.
- This will activate on Tuesday 17th March at 7:00pm.
- The booking system closes on Tuesday 24th March at 12:00pm.
- External clubs will continue to be booked directly through ParentPay and there will be NO STAGGERED BOOKING for these clubs. It will be completed on a first come first served basis.
- PLEASE ENSURE YOU ARE ABLE TO ACCESS PARENTPAY IN ADVANCE.
- PARENTS OF CHILDREN THAT ARE NEW to the school should have been emailed an activation letter, which contains the necessary information to activate their account on ParentPay. They will not be able to book or pay for any items on ParentPay unless their account is activated.

Arts and Crafts

Boys will explore different materials, styles and techniques, they will look at well-known artists and of course they will produce lots of colourful and beautiful pieces of work. Hopefully, this will inspire lots of budding artists!



Board Games

Board games offer opportunities for early learning. Even simple games help young players identify colours, count spaces, and develop hand-eye coordination and dexterity in moving cards and pieces around the board. Board games are an easy way to encourage healthy brain development. They are also lots of fun!



Chess

Chess is an incredibly beneficial pastime because playing chess results in better brain function, improved memory and cognitive abilities, strategic thinking and attention improvement. Lucas and Tony have been coaching chess at St. Anthony's for many years. They have inspired many players over the years and in the Senior House we enter our players in regional competitions and fixtures with other local schools.

Choir

A singing club for Years 1 and 2, exploring a variety of songs and vocal techniques, including hymns, musicals and fun activities involving music and movement.



Coding

Pupils will take their programming skills to the next level with Scratch! They will dive into the world of algorithms, sequences and loops while creating exciting interactive projects – from a talking cat to a boat navigation game and a virtual egg hunt.

Along the way, they will think creatively, tackle challenges, and discover how to turn their ideas into digital creations that move, speak, and respond. It is a fun and imaginative way to strengthen coding skills and confidence!

Fencing – Little Musketeers

Step into a world of adventure, discipline and fun with Little Musketeers – a unique after-school club designed especially for KS1 & KS2 children!

Led by professional coaches trained to Olympic standards, your child will:

- Learn the exciting basics of fencing in a safe, fun environment
- Build confidence, focus, and coordination

Little House of Science

Little House of Science is built on the principle of nurturing the natural curiosity and quest for knowledge which children have about the world around them. The foundation of everything around us is based on the principles of science and we aim to inspire our pupils. Little House of Science is based on teaching Life, Earth and Physical Sciences (covering biology, chemistry, physics, engineering, robotics). Each week, we cover a new topic filled with exciting, risk-free experiments and demonstrations. Our teachers, who are scientists or teachers with a science background, ensure our pupils enjoy a thrilling, fun environment to nurture their creativity and expand their knowledge.

Magic Club

We are very excited to introduce this new and exciting club. The club will be run by Maximus the Magician. The boys at St. Anthony's will be familiar with Maximus as he has performed in several shows for both the Junior and Senior Houses. In this club, he will be revealing some of the tricks of the trade and teaching the boys some fun and mind-boggling tricks.

Minecraft

Minecraft is educational because it enhances creativity, problem-solving, self-direction, collaboration and other life skills. In the classroom, Minecraft complements reading, writing, maths and even history. Both fun and educational, Minecraft is easily on our list of best video games for kids.



Mini Makers Club

A hands-on, creative club designed for young makers who love to build, fold, shape, and invent. The boys explore different crafting techniques while developing fine motor skills, problem-solving, and imaginative thinking. Each week introduces a new project using simple, age-appropriate materials. Examples include constructing with recyclable items, using modelling clay, or STEM challenges.



Playground Games

The boys will do a variety of fun activities and sports. The aim is to introduce them to numerous sports, helping them develop multiple skills and improve all-round coordination.



Table Tennis

Table Tennis has long been a popular break time activity in the Senior House. Hopefully, this Hobby club will help develop the skills of the boys in the Junior House before they make their debuts on the Senior House playground. This term we will be offering coaching sessions on **Monday**.

Jonathan Willett will be running a Wind Band group. The club will take place on Tuesday mornings at 8:30am until 9:00am in the Senior House Music Room. The Wind Band will be a place where saxophones, recorders, flutes and clarinets and brass instruments blend in harmony. Our talented pupils will develop their musicianship and ensemble skills while preparing to perform at school concerts.

Pupils must know at least 5 notes!!!
